

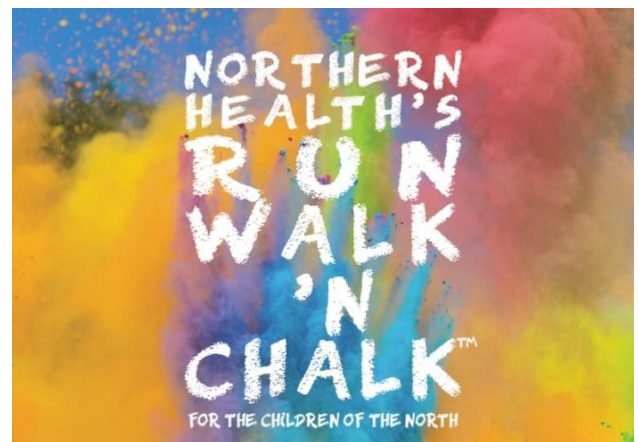


2018 Run Walk 'n Chalk
