Commence in February or May 2021	Work part time at 64 hours per fortnight
Includes 4 rotations across Maternity Services within a 12 month program, primarily based at Northern Health Epping	Rotating rosters, including experience across morning, evening and night shifts
Employed on a 12 month contract, with a retention rate of >90% following program	Annual leave as per award, taken in fortnight blocks, split evenly per rotation
Graduate specific orientation, addressing both clinical and administrative aspects of nursing	Graduate specific study days scheduled throughout the year, with additional PROMPT (Emergency procedures training) and FSEP training days
